

New Scout Campout

DIRECTIONS TO CAMPSITE: ([Google Maps: Jack Webb Ranch, Webb Lane, Chappell Hill, TX 77880](#))

Campsite 1 hour and 20 minutes from Houston. Take Highway 290 northwest to Chappell Hill (notice the spelling of Chappell with 2-Ps & 2-Ls). At the Chappell Hill traffic light, turn right and go north on FM 1155 about 7.6 miles to the dead end at FM 2193. Turn left on FM 2193 and go about 300 yards and turn left through gate at Webb Lane. Follow yard signs & flagging deep into the property, passing around / thru 2 or 3 cattle guards, until you reach the parking area near our campsite. Remember to check-in with the Campmaster, Michael Colson, Cell phone: 713-254-8223.

OUR CAMPGROUND: Jack Webb Ranch on “Webb Lane.” Enter through ranch gate on South side of FM 2193, about 300 yards West of FM 1155 (code is 1775). Our hosts are Mr. & Mrs. Jack Webb. This property has been in Mrs. Webb’s family since Stephen F. Austin’s first colonists – The Old 300 – first began settling Texas in the 1820’s and we’ll be camping on one of the tributaries to New Year’s Creek.

- Tuesday—6pm Pre-campout planning meeting. (New Scouts and Parents do not need to attend)

- Thursday—Pack Your Personal Camping Gear. Pack for the season and weather. Check weather report!
- Friday—Older Scouts arrive Webb Ranch 6:30-ish.
- Saturday
 - 8am SHARP!, New scouts and parents arrive to check-in. New Scouts join their patrols; Parents go to presentation and training about First Class Trail.
 - 9am, after assembly, new scout patrols rotate thru 4 stations for instructions.
 - Lunch Saturday—after assembly, Troop 55 Grubmaster feeds scouts and adults.
 - 4pm, after assembly new scouts set-up their campsites, prepare their own dinner as patrols.
 - 8pm, Campfire followed by Cracker Barrel, new scout patrols enjoy theirs in campsites.
 - 10pm, Lights Out!
- Sunday
 - 6:30am, Breakfast, new scouts cook with patrol. Adults eat separately.
 - 8am, Assembly and “Scout’s Own” Worship Service.
 - 9am, Patrol competitions followed by awards and recognitions.
 - 10am, begin breaking camp, returning patrol gear, loading trailer.
 - noon, if everyone’s campsite is clean and all have claimed their lost & found, Campmaster will dismiss the troop all depart.
